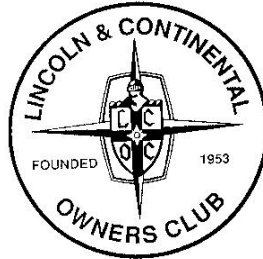

## Our March RMR - LCOC Event – The Historic Brighton Depot Restaurant and The Wild Animal Sanctuary

**Date & Time:** Saturday, March 26, 10:30 AM

**Event:** We are planning to caravan to the Brighton Depot for a 12:00 Noon lunch and then on to the Wild Animal Sanctuary for a guided tour at 2:00 pm and then caravan back to Denver (or go our separate ways). If this seems like a trip that might be difficult for you to drive, please call Truman or Harry and perhaps a car pool can be arranged.

The Brighton Depot was the original depot operated by the Union Pacific Railroad. The Depot serves a varied and inexpensive menu, and they are happy to give us checks for each couple or person. A suggested gratuity of 18% is appreciated. We have dined there before, and service and food was good!



From the Depot we will caravan to the Keenesburg area where the Wild Animal Sanctuary is located. You may have heard about the Sanctuary as they have been in the news lately, just having rescued 25 big lions from Bolivia! PLEASE bring your binoculars and camera; there will be many photo opportunities. Also, this is a good time to include your family and kids and grandkids.

This Sanctuary is just that: A Sanctuary, not a zoo. We will observe the animals from a protected walkway above the Tigers, African Lions, Leopards, Mountain Lions, etc. There are over 70 Tigers, 60 plus Bears, Wolves and other wild residents to see in a natural habitat. 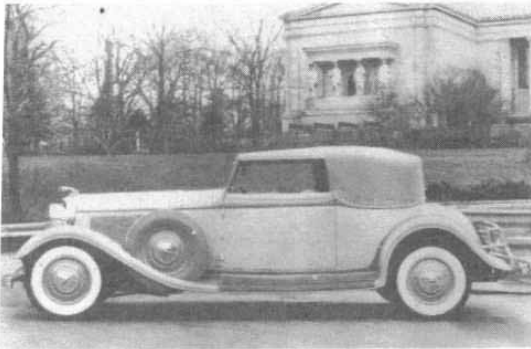

1933

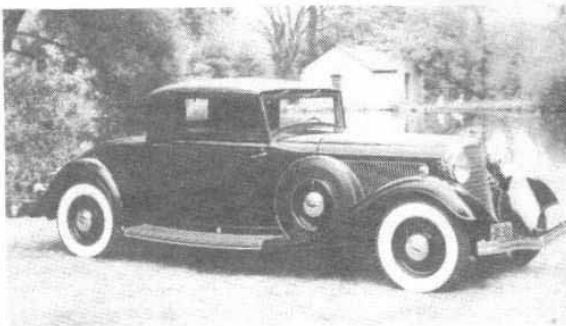


1933 Lincoln, model KB, Brunn convertible victoria, AA

**LINCOLN — SERIES 511 — MODEL KA — TWELVE:** Lincoln concluded the era of the classic V-8 engine with its fork and blade connecting rods by introducing a new 67° V-12 for the KA series. Its displacement was 381.7 cubic inches. Aluminum pistons were installed and the crankshaft was carried in four bearings. The detachable cylinder heads were constructed of cast iron. This engine while based upon the KB V-12 was simpler and less expensive to produce.

A total of 12 models were available in KA form and their styling was once again substantially revised. Lincoln adopted hood louvers rather than shutters for both KA and KB models and an elegant chrome mesh grille sloped backward for a more streamlined profile. Early models continued to use the older clamshell type fenders but mid-way through the model year valanced-type versions were adopted and Lincoln agreed to retro-fit them to the early 1933 models at no cost to owners.

**LINCOLN — SERIES 251 — MODEL KB — TWELVE:** The KB had the same basic styling of the KA but its considerably larger size and available custom bodywork left no chance of being mistaken for a KA. A new double-drop frame was introduced for 1933.

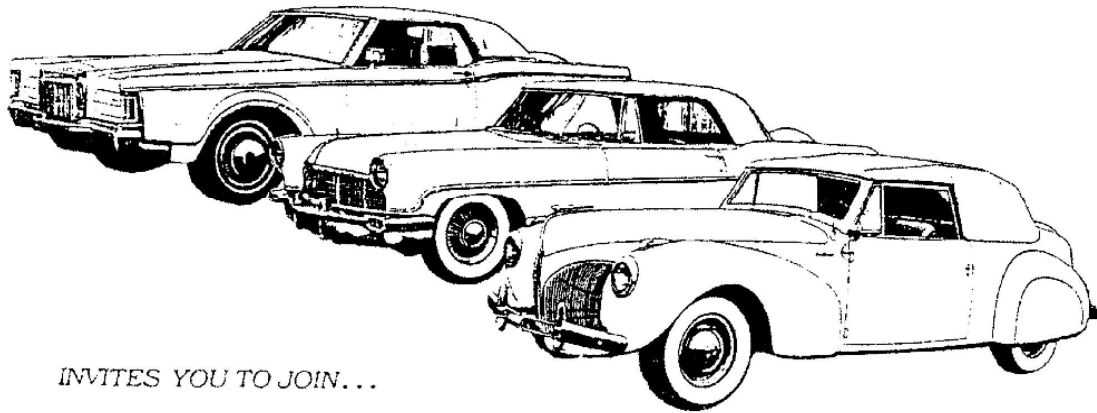
